

Security - Granting Access to Desktop Users



Discoverer allows security to be given in two different ways ...

Users get access to a Business Area or
Business Areas are made accessible to Users

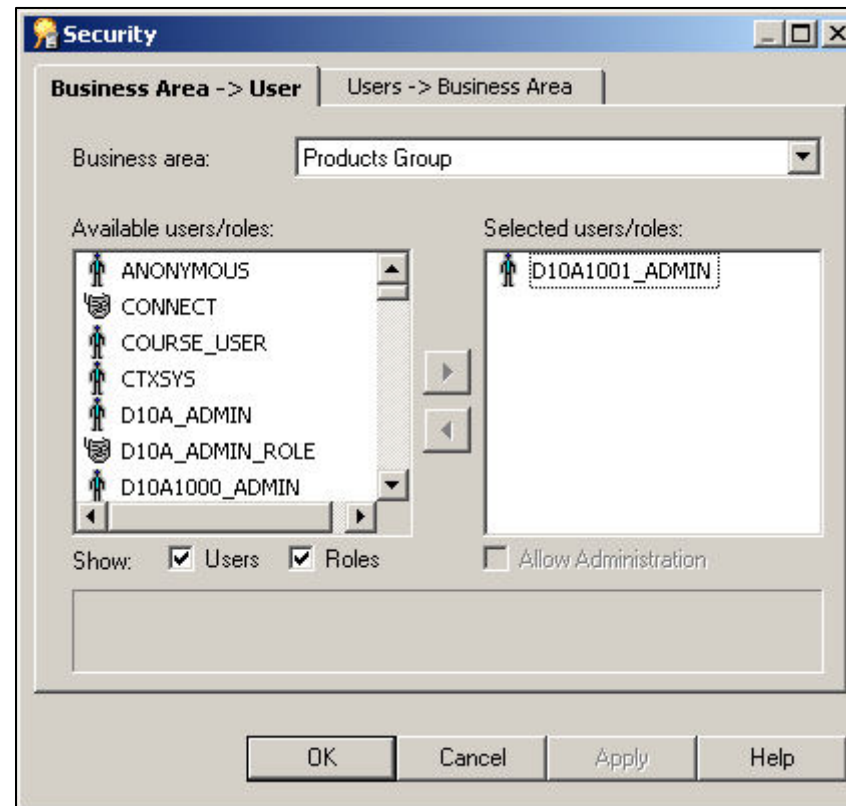
Both result in the same access but are different ways of bulk specifying security

Select Security from the Tools menu or use the Toolbar icon

Security - Granting Access to Desktop Users



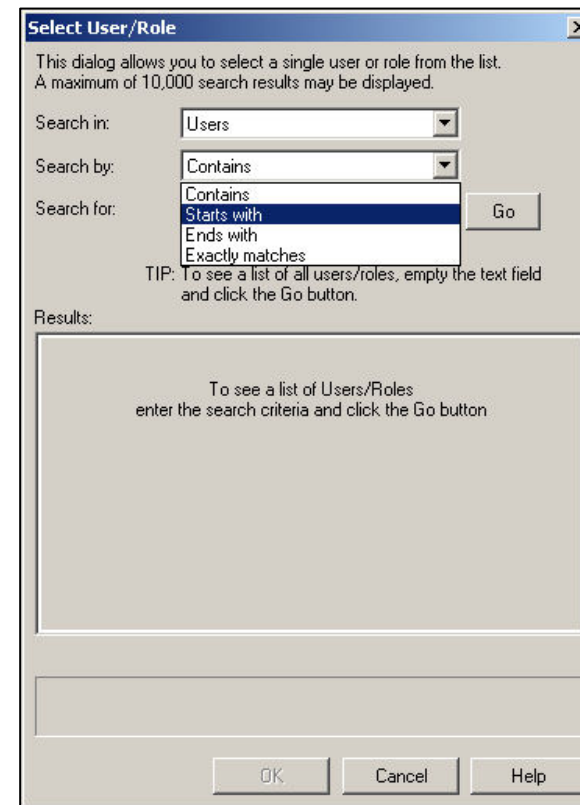
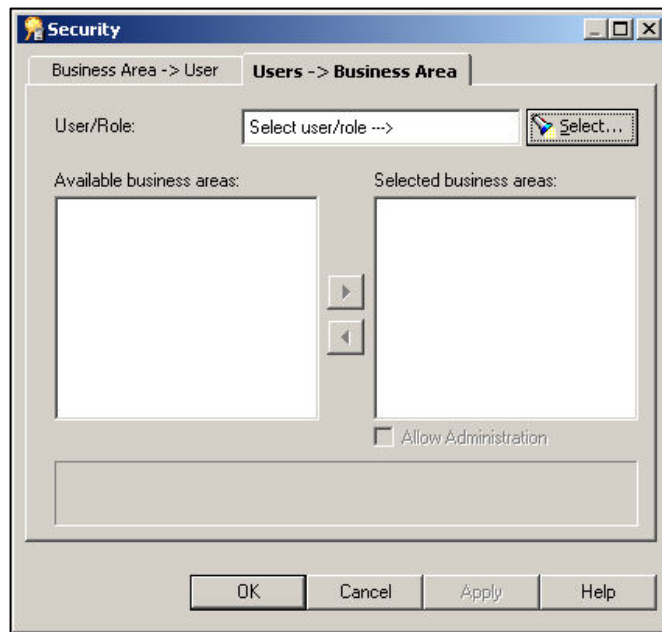
This shows how Users are added to an individual Business Area, note that the masks denote a Role.



Security - Granting Access to Desktop Users



This is the second tab and shows how the Administrator can assign a series of Business Areas to a selected User, note the dialog for selecting a User is the same as the one when creating the EUL.

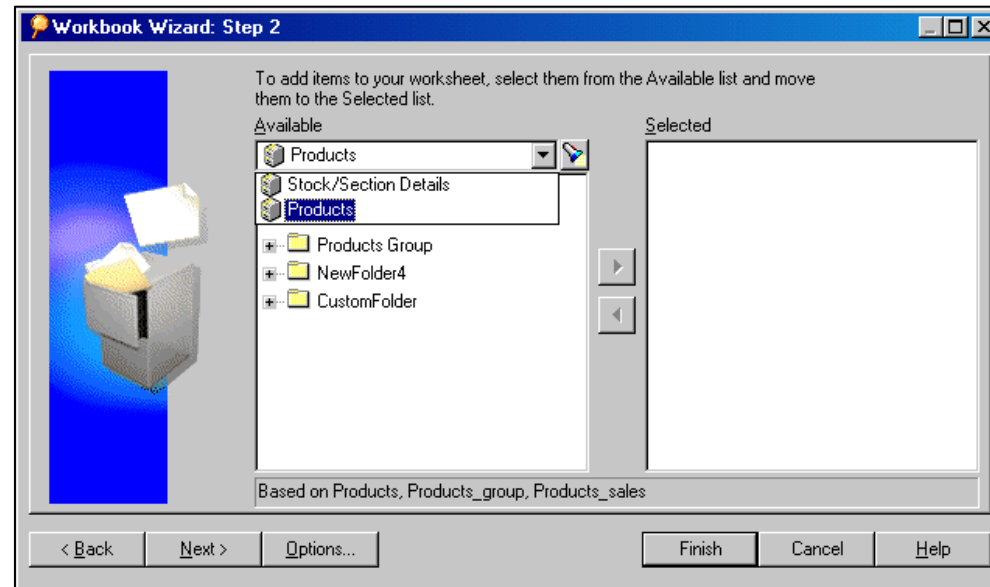


Security - Granting Access to Desktop Users



Once the User has been assigned a Business Area this is now available within Desktop with the default set of privileges.

All items within the business area, as long as they have the Visible to User property set to true, will also be visible and available for use in a query.



Privileges - Discoverer Administrator Privileges



As with Security, Discoverer allows privileges to be given in two different ways ...

Users get access to a Privilege or
Privileges are made accessible to Users

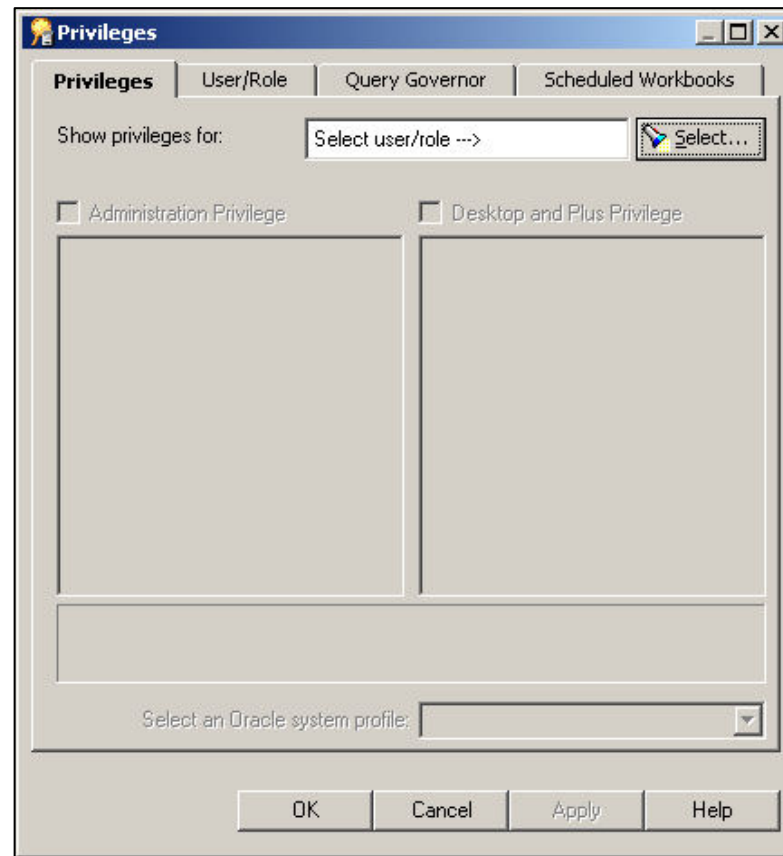
Both have the same effect

Select Privileges from the Tools menu or use the Toolbar icon, note that if Security (ie access to a Business Area) has not been given to the User then the privileges will not be of use until such time as Security has been granted.

Privileges - Granting Privileges to Desktop Users



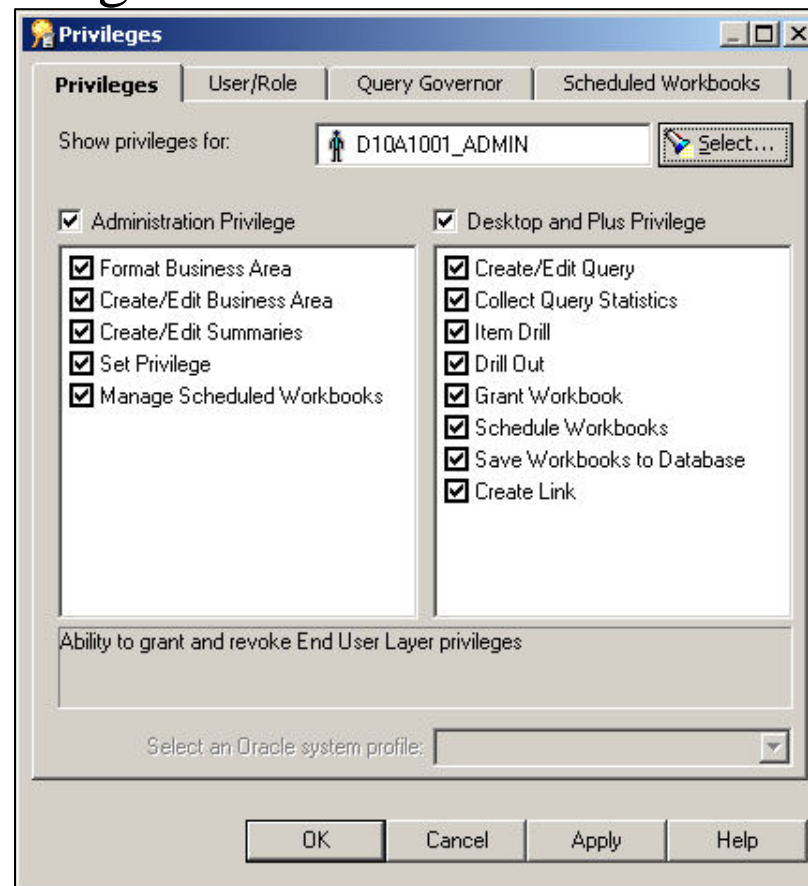
This first tab will show all available privileges for a selected User, split into Administration and User types, the selection process is the same as the previously outlined ...



Privileges - Granting Privileges to Desktop Users



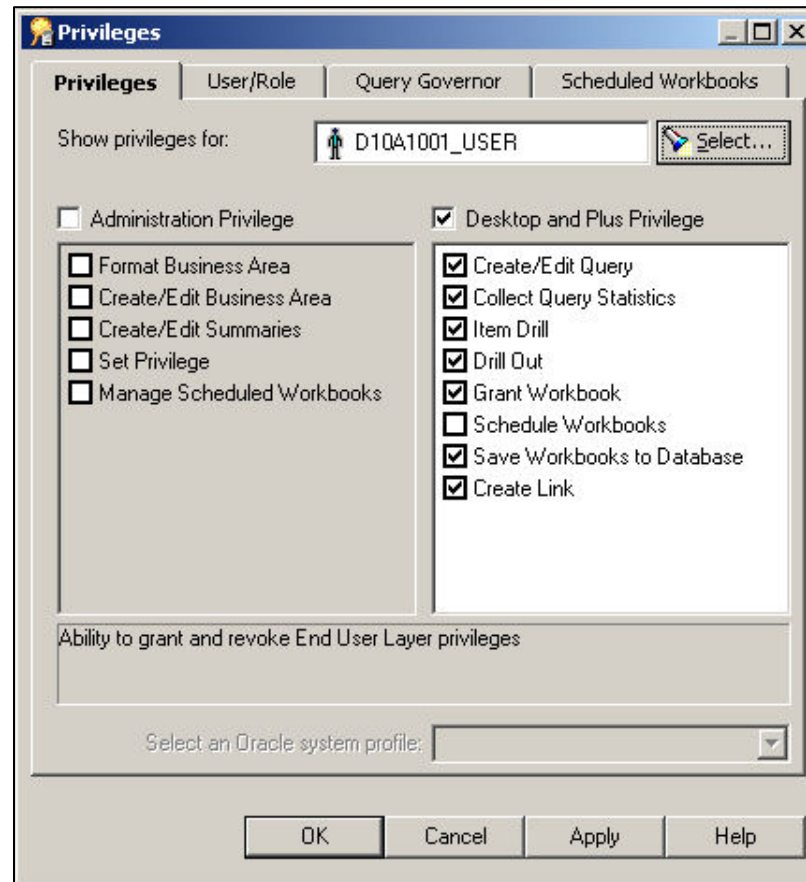
Note that this is the standard privileges granted to the Owner of the EUL, to allow other Users the same access simply replicate these settings in their Privileges



Privileges - Granting Privileges to Desktop Users



These are the standard privileges granted to any other User/Role in the Database for the current End User Layer, note that as a User the default is not to be able to schedule Workbooks ...





Privileges - Granting Users to Privileges

The second tab is the reverse of the first, here all privileges are listed and the Administrator selects Users/Roles who are to have the benefit of them ...
