# Where Clauses - Fetch first rows of a Table in Oracle 12c (Top-N)



Not strictly part of a where clause but fetch can be used to limit records displayed with far more control than using the rownum.

In the following examples a table called numbers contains values from 1 to 10.

select value from numbers fetch first 3 rows only

#### **VALUE**

# Where Clauses - Using Percent with Fetch in Oracle 12c



The percent option will limit the records displayed to a specified percentage of the following ...

select value from numbers fetch first 20 percent rows only

**VALUE** 

-----

1

2

# Where Clauses - Using Offset with Fetch in Oracle 12c



The offset option will specify the number of records off the top to ignore before displaying ...

select value from numbers offset 6 rows fetch first 2 rows only

**VALUE** 

-----

7

8

### Where Clauses - Using With Ties with Fetch in Oracle 12c



The with ties option will include duplicate values found even if they will push the number retrieved past the specified numbers.

Here the numbers table has had an additional 4 added ...

select value from numbers order by value fetch first 4 rows with ties

VALUE

	2
	3
	4
	4
